

Greetings, all! In my first musing, I introduced myself a bit. Allow me to continue that introduction and say a bit more about what it means for me to be your Synodically Approved Minister. At the most basic level, it means that the Bishop of the Southern Ohio Synod has appointed me (entrusted me) to be your minister as I work toward ordination. Since I went to a non-Lutheran seminary, and since I am coming to Good Shepherd from another faith tradition (Baptist), I have entered a program sponsored by the Synod called TEEM (Theologically Educated Emerging Ministers). In this program, I will attend some seminary classes to shore up my "Lutheranism." In the meantime, the Bishop has given me the blessing and authority to run the worship services, officiate Communion, Baptisms and Funerals, and lead our congregation (since Marriage requires state licensure, I am not able to officiate a wedding until after my ordination). How long will it take to get ordained? We are still figuring that out! I will let you know once the Synod program leaders decide how much training I need.

For now, I want you to know that I am available to meet with you, to visit the sick at home or in the hospital, to serve on the Executive Council, and, most importantly, just to get to know you. See the bulletin for my contact information or call the church office and ask Maria. At this time, I am still employed by S4 NetQuest, a Learning Services Firm in Columbus, Ohio, as the VP of Operations and Instructional Design Lead. I will be working with our Executive Council to determine when and how I should be transitioning out of that role.

One final thing . . . what should you call me? The title of pastor in the Lutheran Church is reserved for those who are ordained and called to serve a church. So, technically, I am working towards being your official pastor. Until then, you can call me whatever you are comfortable calling me ("Hey you!" or "Don" or "Your most High and Eminent Holiness" (just kidding)). I am honored and humbled just to be here, walking, running, stumbling, on this journey we call life with God and His people.

Until next time, keep praying and keep growing in faith.


