

Good Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church November 2025 Newsletter

As previously reported Terry Rust and Skip Warner began painting the exterior doors of the Church on July 22, 2025, and completed all 8 of them Friday, October 17, 2025. There remains a few "finishing/touch up items" on all the doors such as painting or staining the thresholds, installing a brass kick plates and door sweeps but these items will be completed the week of Sunday through Saturday, October 19 – 25, 2025, respectively.

On Saturday, October 18, 2025, Property Committee members Richard Kogler, Terry Rust and Skip Warner cut down the Maiden Grass on the south lawn. The Garden Committee members were also very active and cleaned up the Garden Plots as well. The Maiden Grass and garden recycling was hauled off to C & S Tree Service, 2551 Dayton Rd, for recycling.

The North and South Tower Roofs were inspected over the months of September and October of 2025. A roofing vendor has been chosen, and the South Tower "Arch Window Level Roof" (i.e., roof above the Old Sacristy) will be replaced, as well as rebuilding of 2 North Tower Hatches that had deteriorated to the point of requiring replacement. All 4 roofs will be cleaned and the "field cloth/screening mesh" around all Arch Windows will be inspected and secured as necessary. Stay tuned to learn more about this planned work at the upcoming Congregational Meeting on Sunday, November 9, 20256.




